



We had several objectives in mind for my first year in office. We feel we have made great strides in accomplishing our goals, for example:


- Increased utilization of Inmate Programs

Corrections Center 2017 Bookings







Bed Days Saved in 2017 was 3,535 which was a **76% increase** over 2016



21,722 Total Calls for Service in 2017


















Incident/Call Volume

2016 Calls for Service






20 Year Call Volume / Law Enforcement Staffing Comparing Trends




10 Year Staffing / Traffic Citation Comparison














Looking toward the Future

Challenges Facing Corrections:

- Trends in Bookings per year and Average Population seem to be increasing and we need to plan ahead in the event numbers continue to rise:
 - Increasing Capacity to utilize Inmate Programs to reduce Bed Days
 - Increased Staff in Corrections
 - Increased Budget for Contracted Services
 - Inmate Medical and Psychological Treatment
 - Inmate Food
 - Utilities impacted by increased Inmate counts
 - Recruiting and retaining quality staff

Looking toward the Future

Challenges Facing Law Enforcement

- Staffing in the Detective Bureau to reduce case load of the Detective assigned to Sexual Assault cases.
 - Staffing for a Domestic Violence Investigator
 - Staffing to conduct technology crimes and assist in technology based evidence recovery
 - Trend of increasing call volumes over last few years
 - Stress on overtime budget due to increased enforcement and Court time
